Thanks to all of you, we had a successful Bon Dance this year, too! The weather was extremely fine - no rain at all! Everyone enjoyed the joyous time and place together without being worried about the weather.

Especially in Hawaii, the Bon Dance is a religious, cultural, and historical community event. We are able to feel oneness at this wonderful time through remembering our loved ones and ancestors. Thank you very much for your dedicated help and participation. I hope we can ask for your support again next year to have a successful 2020 Bon Dance. Next year our Hatsubon service and Bon Dance will be held on FRIDAY, July 3, 2020, because the 4th of July will be on Saturday.

We are glad to announce that, this September, we are having our Fall Ohigan service on September 8 at the Kaneohe Higashi Hongwanji and the Hawaii District Hoonko service on September 15 at Higashi Hongwanji Betsuin.

**Ohigan** literally means "the other shore," and "Shigan" means "this shore." Between the other shore and this shore,

there is a river called "Sanzu no kawa (Sanzu River)" which is a river of three poisons.

Ohigan also means, "reaching the other shore," which is the Pure Land beyond the river of three poisons. Buddhism sutras say that when people pass away, they go to the Pure Land. The Pure Land is in the west, and, on Ohigan, the sun rises from the exact east and sets in the exact west. Ohigan occurs around the equinox in the Spring and Fall. Therefore, at the time of Ohigan, we are closest to the exact west of the Pure Land. This is why we traditionally think about loved ones in the Pure Land at this time.

Hoonko is the memorial service honoring our founder, Shinran Shonin. This service is the biggest and most significant event for Jodo Shinshu followers. We have learned about and been nurtured by the Buddha Dharma through Shinran Shonin. At Hoonko, we express our gratitude and respect to Shinran Shonin by gathering, chanting, and hearing the Buddha Dharma together. This is the Hoonko tradition Pure Land followers have been observing.

These Ohigan and Hoonko services have been held for a very long time and enable us to demonstrate our respect and gratitude to those ancestors and our founder Shinran Shonin. Through these services, we also have opportunities to reexamine ourselves by listening to the Buddha Dharma.

I hope to see you at these important services and share the teaching together.
