Minister's Message

NAMUAMIDABUTSU, WHERE REV. MATSUMOTO MEETS REV. SAWADA

In the Hondo, while doing the daily morning service, facing the back of me is Matsumoto sensei's picture and Sensei Ryojin

Soga's words which are written (信に死し、願に生きよShin ni shishi, Gan ni Ikiyo) and which means: "Put my deep faith in Buddha's Truth and Wisdom till my death. The Great Aspiration of Buddha lives in me eternally." In a few words, it means that in this world, I entrust in the Buddha's Wisdom which overcomes my ego, my beliefs, and my body. It takes me, laying the deep faith on to realize that Amida Buddha works to return us to the Ultimate Reality."

It will almost be six months since we arrived. I honestly felt a little disappointed to find such a small number of members in February 2021 coming to the temple services and doing the usual activities such as Omigaki (polishing altar's ornaments), temple cleaning, and flower arrangements.

The initial feeling of being comfortable before arriving was changed to despair because for some reason lots of important things in the temple's life hadn't been working for a long time.

The despair of the situation made me feel confused and I thought that maybe I should return to Hilo. But I felt touched and appreciative for the small group of 4 to 5 people doing everything possible to keep this DOJO (place to learn) alive. From their dedication I realized my own egotistical way of thinking. I had been living in my own "cocoon" within a world of fantasy that I created about Kaneohe Higashi Hongwanji, thinking it should be this way or that way.

I'm in front of the altar facing the Amida Buddha and the Jodo Shinshu masters and in back of me is Matsumoto sensei. Through those active members, I feel the presence of Matsumoto Sensei and all members who have passed on before us who built this temple. Their message is to listen to the Dharma and make the Buddha Dharma the path for me to follow here.

I'm sure that the magical mix of imagination and inspiration from all the Kaneohe Higashi Hongwanji's Sangha members who made its history provides my purpose and foundation to be here.

My judgmental mind attached to the past and projecting into the future moves me from my small and limited world to reach the world of The Great Compassion of Buddha right now. It works to make me realize (awaken to) the world of the Ultimate Reality.

In all of my journey as a minister, I cannot forget my father who recently passed away a few weeks ago at the age of 99. My respectful mentor, my father Reverend Nobuyuki Sawada, with my mother Reverend Ritsuko Sawada, gave me the base of Buddhism. I learned from their dedicated lessons of life spreading Buddhism their entire lives.

Everything in my father's life was dedicated as a messenger of Buddha's teaching. He was a quiet man. He never talked badly of others. He was a very ordinary man who never put himself first. He was very humble and pure and had a strong focus on spreading the Buddha's teaching.

My dad was considered a *JYAKUHEI* (Weakest soldiers Battalion in WW2) in the Japanese Army. His battalion was comprised of 400 soldiers, and after 4 years in battle, only 17 survived. After the war, he returned to Japan and couldn't meet his mother anymore because she had died during the war. My grandpa, a Buddhist minister, supported him while he studied and followed the path of becoming a minister. My dad worked for 40 years in Brazil doing missionary work, during the time I grew up.

I always have fun memories of dad, quietly doing what he liked: making **Amanatto** (Sweet beans candy), sharpening knives, making flower vases for the temple's altar, creating his different sauces and dressings for BBQ. I didn't understand him in my youth. I criticized him for being a very egotistical man who was in his own world, but here now I find myself doing the same tasks he used to do. Now in my mind I'm looking at his back while embracing him when he used to ride a small green LEONETTE motorbike with my mom and his 3 sons.

During his long trips to spread the Dharma, his old car used to break down in the middle of the jungle and its unpaved roads. My mom used to be concerned whenever he went on his long journeys to conduct memorial services for the faraway communities of Japanese. They were expecting sensei to come to talk about Buddhism.

Sensei Nobuyuki Sawada encountered a lot of MYOKOUNIN (layperson with deep faith in Buddha's Wisdom) and some followers used to say that Sawada Sensei was the reincarnation of Master Shinran Shonin.

He still continues making kites and toys for us, his children, and repeatedly does Dharma talks delivering the same resounding message every time. He is an honest and humble man, always guided by the words NAMUAMIDABUTSU.

Like my father in his life, I have a lot of physical and emotional struggles but I never quit following the SHINJIN's path (Deep faith in Buddha's Wisdom).

He continues protecting me and guiding me as the light of Buddha's Wisdom and Compassion.

From his eyes, I can realize Matsumoto Sensei and KHH members' legacies and the power of the Dharma working now amongst us. Those dedicated Nembutsu followers, Reverend Sawada, Reverend Matsumoto and Mrs. Tomoko - they are here now guiding us to be really happy. Together let's call the name of AMIDA BUDDHA, NAMUAMIDABUTSU!

Thank you, Reverend Matsumoto and Reverend Nobuyuki Sawada, great masters!

Dad, you are my inspiration to follow this path as minister. You have my greatest respect. I miss you a lot. You are my sensei
